 Rice of Greenville District and State aforesaid for and in consideration
 of the sum of two hundred and fifty dollars to me in hand paid by Joel
 Shelton of the District and State aforesaid have granted bargained sold
 and released, and by these Presents do grant bargain sell and release
 unto the said Joel Shelton All that Plantation or Tract of Land lying
 & being Situate in the District and State aforesaid on the waters of Gilder's
 Creek, beginning on a black Oak on the original line, cornering to W. Snow
 it being a conditional corner, thence along the said conditional line to
 Stake corner on the original line to W. Snow, S. 10. 10 to James Seaburns
 line, then along said line to a Conditional line by H. Griffin, then with
 the Conditional line cornering to Stake in the old line then N. 10 E. to the
 beginning including One hundred and fifty acres more or less the
 Land to be Conveyed was ^{originally} granted to Joseph Rice by his excellency
 Charles Pinckney, on the sixth of June 1791. & Conveyed to Caleb
 Rice to Isaac Rice, together with all and singular the
 Rights members hereditaments & appurtenances to the premises
