

 made the first day of October One thousand eight hundred and three
 and in the twenty seventh Year of American Independence, between
 William Anderson Sheriff of Greenville District and State aforesaid of
 the one part and David Thomas of the other part. Witnesses the
 Whereas Joseph M. Cool is seized in fee simple him and his heirs
 for ever a certain parcel or tract of land containing two hundred &
 sixty two acres lying and being on Elisha Thompsons Beaver dam brook
 in the District aforesaid, beginning on a Poplar, running North Ten West
 29 c. 50 links to a post oak, from thence North 30 West 27 c. 50 links
 to a post oak, from thence South 65 West 67 c. 50 links to a Stake
 thence South 24 East 17 c. 50 links to a Post oak, thence North 78 East
 23 c. to a White Oak, from thence to the beginning. & WHEREAS
 Samuel Farrar Esq. did at October Court One thousand Eight hundred
 Commence an action of debt in the Court of Common Pleas of Greenville
 against Joseph M. Cool in which action such proceedings were
 had in the said Court that said "Farrar" did at March Court 1801.
 Obtain a Judgment against said Joseph M. Cool for the sum of one hundred
 thirty & eight dollars and the sum of of 29 & 16. Cent by him expended in
 behalf of s^d. suit as by the Record of said Court will appear, in
 Pursuance of which Judgment there issued from said Court a Writ of
 Fieri Facias tested by the Honorable John F. Grimke Esq. associate Judge
 of said State in the year One thousand Eight hundred and three and of the
 Independence of America as above, Directed to all and singular the
 Sheriffs of the State aforesaid. Commanding them each or either of them
