


South Carolina Know all men by these presents that I Bayles Earle of Spartanburgh District and state aforesaid in consideration of the sum of Two hundred Dollars to me paid by Toab Heald of Greenville District and state aforesaid I have Bargained Sold and Released and by these presents do grant Bargain Sell and Release unto the said Toab Heald in his entire possession a plantation or tract of Land, lying and being in Greenville District on the wildcat Creek of South Tyger river. Beginning on a post oak bearing N. 75. E. 39° to a Black Jack thence S. 20. E. 41. 75° to a post oak thence S. 70. W. 44. 50° to a large Hickory thence N. 18. W. 39. 20° to the beginning Post oak. Containing by Estimation one hundred and eighty two acres the same being a tract of Land granted to Samuel Shaw on the twenty fifth day of January in the year one thousand seven hundred and eighty four and the said tract of Land at the Instance of John D. Young, condemned and sold by the County Court of Greenville and purchased by Bayles Earles and by order of said Court John Hunt Esqr. then Sheriff made on the 11th day of February 1804 the Clerk's office being had will fully appear containing by Estimation one hundred and eighty two acres more or less the same being the plantation where on the said Heald now lives — together with all and singular the rights members Tenements and Appurtenances unto the said premises Belonging or in any wise ~~to~~ appertaining to have and to hold all and singular the premises before mentioned unto the said Toab Heald his heirs and assigns forever and I do hereby Bind myself my heirs Executors and administrators to warrant and forever defend all and singularly the said premises unto the said Toab Heald his heirs and assigns against myself and my heirs and against every other person whomsoever lawfully claiming or to claim therein or any part thereof In Witness whereof I the said Bayles Earle have here unto set my hand and affixed my Seal this twenty eighth day of February one thousand Eight hundred and four and in the thirtieth year of America's Independence — Signed Sealed and delivered in the presence of us —
