we Taylor & Cherry --- of the District and State aforesaid, in consideration of the sum of one
hundred Dollars to us in hand paid by Sam^l Williams of Greenville District & State afores
aid have granted, bargained sold, & released, and by these presents do grant, bargain, sell
and release, unto the s^d Samuel Williams his heirs and assigns a plantation or tract
of land, situate lying & being in the state aforesaid, and District of Greenville, on both sides
of Green Creek, lying Saluda river, containing one hundred and fifty acres more or less
being the balance of a tract, of the same quantity of acres, granted to Lewis Griffin the first day
of August 1785 by his Excellency William Moultrie being all the original survey of the same
tract of land except a small part, on the lower end of s^d tract which we have conveyed to Jacob
Cochly his old fence now being the division of the same, - Together with all and singular
the rights, members, Hereditaments, and appurtenances to said premises belonging, or appertaining
thereto To have & to hold all and singular the said premises before mentioned unto the s^d
Samuel Williams his heirs and assigns forever and We hereby bind our selves our
