Have Bargained sold & set over and by these presents do bargain sell & set over unto the said William Young and George Salmon their heirs or assigns one negro woman slave named Venus Together with her former & future increase or issue that was willed to my wife Pippillia Young alias Sinclair by her father Robert Sinclair. And I do for myself my heirs Executors and administrators warrant and forever defend unto (the said)
