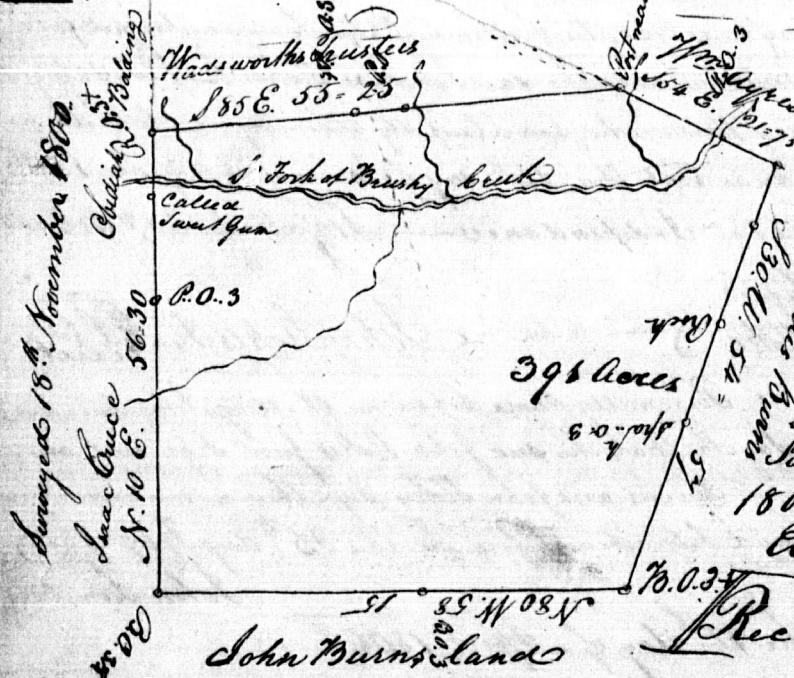


platt here annexed & presents, Together with all and singular the rights, moneys, hereditaments and appurtenances to the said premises belonging or in any way incident or appertaining To have and To hold all and singular the premises before mentioned unto the said Hugh Rogers his heirs and assigns forever, A part of the same tract of lands which William Turpin and Benjamin Wadsworth of the city of Charleston S<sup>t</sup> State of said Executors to the last will & testament, of Thomas Wadsworth of Charleston of said decedent, granted to the said Samuel Miles Samuel Brown Isaac Kirk & John Cooke by deed bearing date the 19<sup>th</sup> day of March 1804; (Including several other tracts besides this) which deed is recorded in the Registers Office for Newbury District in book F<sup>t</sup> Page 272: reference therunto had will more at large appears this tract is part of a tract of four hundred & eighty acres granted by Governor Moultrie on the 7<sup>th</sup> of November 1785 to William King, and by said William King conveyed to Wadsworth & Turpin and a quit claim from William Turpin to Thomas Wadsworth duly recorded in the clerks office of Greenville District S<sup>t</sup> E. page, 229 & 230 & 231 and we the said Samuel Miles Samuel Brown & Isaac Kirk & John Cooke as a special committee appointed by the Society of Friends or Quakers on Bush River to receive titles for said lands on behalf of said Society, were ordered by the said Society, to sell the same, we therefore bind ourselves our Executors administrators or Successors on behalf of said Society to warrant and forever defend all & singular the said premises be the same more or less, heretofore granted & sold unto the said Hugh Rogers his heirs & assigns against ourselves, our heirs & Successors on behalf of ourselves & of said Society & against every Person whomsoever lawfully claiming or to claim the same or any part thereof - Witness our hands & seals this second day of December in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred & five and in the thirtieth year of this Independence of the United States of America, Signed sealed & Delivered in the presence of us, the words "part of" interlined & John Cooke's name erased out first

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 State of South Carolina: Know all men by these presents that I John Kittland of the County of Greenville S<sup>t</sup> State aforesaid, in consideration of the sum of Sixty pounds to me paid by Samuel M<sup>c</sup>Clene of the same State & County of Hartenburgh, Have granted bought & sold unto the said Samuel M<sup>c</sup>Clene a certain tract or parcel of land lying and being in the county of Greenville near the ancient Indian boundary line Beginning at a place running thence N<sup>o</sup> 40 W<sup>t</sup> to a rock thence S<sup>o</sup> 50 W<sup>t</sup> 27<sup>th</sup> chains
