





State S<sup>c</sup> Carolina Greenville District; Know all men by these Presents that I Joseph Devinport of the State & District aforesaid: for & in consideration of Two hundred dollars to me in hand paid by Hewlet Sullivant of the state & District aforesaid: Have granted bargain- ed sold and Released unto the said Hewlet Sullivant all that tract of land or Plantation contain- ing one hundred and fourteen acres more or less situate in the State & District aforesaid on horse Creek & Poplar bottom Branch water of Ruddy River.. Beginning on a red oak 3<sup>d</sup> & 4<sup>th</sup> corner S. 50. W. 51. 50. to a hickory 3<sup>d</sup> then a S. 85. E. 50. 50. to a red oak 3<sup>d</sup> then N. 10. E. 25. 00 to a beach 3<sup>d</sup> then up the poplar bottom branch with its meanders to the Beginning corner East granted to Mary Burns by a grant bearing date the 3<sup>d</sup> of October 1787 Recorded in the Secretaries office Grant book N. K. K. K. then conveyed to Martin Gollison & then from said Gollison to Andrew Jones and then from s<sup>d</sup> Jones to Joseph Devinport & from David Devinport to Hewlet Sullivant -- Together with all and singular the rights, moneys, here detements, & appurtenances unto the afores<sup>d</sup> Premises belonging or in any wise appertaining To Have and To Hold all and singular the premises before mentioned unto the said Hewlet Sullivant his heirs & assigns forever. And I Joseph Devinport: do hereby bind myself my heirs & assigns To warrant & never defend all and singular the said Premises unto the s<sup>d</sup> Hewlet Sullivant his heirs & assigns against myself my heirs & every other person whatsoever Lawful- ly claiming or to claim the same or any part thereof: In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand & Seal this 5<sup>th</sup> day of January 1805: & in the twenty ninth year of the Independance of the United States of America ..
