

Beginning on a red oak thence the various courses that is represented in a deed given by John Rice to me the said Samuel Moore for the said plantation & tract of land lying & being in the State & district aforesaid, on the waters of the N. Saluda River, which said tract & plantation of lands, I do hereby for myself my heirs Executors adm<sup>rs</sup> & assigns warrant & forever defend unto the said Edward Staten his heirs Executors adm<sup>rs</sup> & assigns all and singular the premises & hereditaments & every part & parcel of the said land, against any person or persons ever claiming or lawfully to claim the same or any part thereof.
