South Carolina, Know all men by these presents that I John Lucas of Greenville District and State aforesaid, in consideration of the sum of Two hundred dollars to me in hand paid by William Few of the State and district aforesaid Have granted bargained sold and released and by these presents do grant bargain sell release and confirm unto said William Few all that tract of land lying in Greenville District on South Sugar River Beginning on a white oak corner on said Few's line running thence N. to the W. to a Conditional B.O. corner made between said Lucas and Wm^m Subb then to the W. on a Conditional line to a Spanish oak on the Sink hole branch thence down S. to a corner to John Lowers line, thence S. with said Lowers line to the corner thence W. with said Lowers line to the river, thence down the meanders of said River to said Few's line with said Few's line to the beginning white oak corner, same land being a part of Two Surveys one being granted by His Excellency Benjamin Gurard on the twenty first day of February 1785, to Nicholas Jasper & the other to John Lucas granted by His Excellency Charles Pinckney bearing date 2nd day of May 1798 the same being one hundred acres more or less. With all and singular the rights members hereditaments and appurtenances to the said premises belonging or in anywise appertaining To have and To hold all and singular the premises before mentioned unto the said William Few his heirs and assigns forever And I do hereby bind myself my heirs Executors and administrators to warrant and forever defend all and singular the S. premises to the said William Few his heirs and assigns Against myself my heirs or against any other person or persons whatsoever Lawfully claiming or to claim the same or any part thereof - In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this 4th day of July in the year of our Lord one thousand Eight hundred & six, and thirtieth year of American Independence - Signed sealed and delivered in presence of us
