Know all men by these presents that I William Tubb of the State and district aforesaid for and in consideration of the sum of one hundred and fifty dollars to me in hand paid by Thomas Fisher of the district and state aforesaid have granted bargained sold and released unto the said Thomas Fisher that tract or parcel of land containing one hundred and fifty acres more or less situated lying and being in the State and district aforesaid beginning at a Spanish oak, Running N. E. 27. 85. - 50 to a Black oak thence a S. E. course to where it shall intersect the path, thence along the said path to head of the branch to white oak, thence to another white oak, thence to a stake corner, upon the road near the sandy place, thence along the old road until it shall intersect a well line, thence along the well line until it shall intersect the line of the said tract a south course thence to a head of branch of Ennee near Mr. Godsey thence to head or main corner of George Tubbs Spring branch to a blazed persimmon tree and thence taking the main of said branch downwards until it shall intersect the of the said tract of land and thence to the Spanish oak. The plan of beginning
