 to a Stake from thence N.W. 45. 80. to the Beginning as may more fully appear Reference being  
 had to the original grant, which Land was on the fourth day of April one thousand  
 seven hundred and Eighty five, granted by His Excellency William Mathew to the said  
 John Johnson, Together with all and singular the Premises Rights members hereditaments  
 and appurtenances to the said Land Belonging or in any wise Incident or appertaining

 granted to Archibald Atkens the third day of October, in the year of our Lord one thou-
