Know all men by these presents, that I John Cox of Greenville District in the State aforesaid for and in consideration of two hundred & fifty dollars to me in hand paid by Joshua Cox of the State and district aforesaid, I have granted bargained sold & by these presents do grant bargain sell and Release unto the said Joshua Cox all that tract or parcel of land supposed to contain one hundred and fifty acres be the same more or less, it being a part of a tract of 640 acres originally granted Margaret Cooke the 21st day of January 1785. and recorded in grant book A.A.A. page 441. Situate in the State and district aforesaid on both sides of Maple creek waters of Enoree river, Beginning on a hickory corner old made between said Cox & Henry Oldham on the west side of said Maple creek, and runs on a dividing line between said Cox John and Joshua Cox N 39. 46' Chaining to a stake corner old, thence on the original line thence on said original line due east to a post oak corner old, thence S 55. E. to where said line crosses George Saunders Spring branch thence down the meanders of said branch to a black gum corner new at the confluence of said branch into said maple creek thence a direct line to the beginning hickory corner which includes the full land to be conveyed be the same more or less, Together with all and singular the rights members, hereditaments & appurtenances thereto belonging or in any wise incident or appertaining, to the only proper use and behoof of himself the said Joshua Cox his heirs Executors, Adm^{rs} and assigns against myself my heirs Executors and administrators, and every person whomsoever lawfully claiming or to claim the same or any part thereof, under my or by virtue of any authority from me or my heirs Executors adm^{rs} and so. Witness my hand and seal this 7th day of March in the year of our Lord 1808. and in the thirty third year of American Independancy: Test — — —
