 line between said Blackwell & Rubin Martin croes said path thence the conditional line  
 to a red oak corner thence a conditional line between said Blackwell & William  
 Martin to the original line to a Stake, thence the original to a Branch of ready river  
 a line between S<sup>r</sup> Blackwell & W<sup>m</sup> Southern thence up said branch to the fork thence the  
 ridge a conditional line, between said Blackwell & Southern to the Beginning Together  
 with all and singular the rights members hereditament and appurtenancy to the said  
 premises belonging or in any wise incident or appertaining. I have also to hold all and  
 singular the premises before mentioned unto the said James Tinsley his Heirs & assigns  
 forever, and I do hereby bind myself my heirs Executors & administrators to warrant  
 and forever defend all and singular the said Premises unto the said James Tinsley  
 by heirs and assigns against myself heirs and assigns - and against every other person  
 whomsoever lawfully claiming or to claim the same or any part thereof -
