that I David Brock of the district of Greenville and State aforesaid in
consideration of the sum of Two hundred Dollars to him in hand paid by John
Duncan of Greenville District and State aforesaid, Have granted bargained sold
and released, and by these presents do grant bargain sell and release unto the said
John Duncan a tract of land, containing one hundred and twenty five acres, more or
less being and lying in Greenville District on one side of Duncan's branch of Cuddy
River and taken out a large survey of 489 acres granted to Juonny Langston
by his excellency William Moultrie Esq. bearing date the third day of April one thousand
seven hundred and eight six. In Secretaries office Grant book K. K. K. page
119. Beginning at Walter Sammons Spring branch on his line from thence to a
post oak, from thence to a red oak, from thence to a hickory from thence on Brock's
line to Pine running on Robert Duncan's line to said branch then up the branch
