Know all men by these presents that I Joseph Ship of State and County aforesaid, in consideration of the sum of Nine hundred Dollars to me in hand paid by William Dunklin of the State of South Carolina and Greenville District, Have granted bargained sold and Released, and by these presents do grant bargain sell and release, unto the said William Dunklin all that parcel or tract of land lying on Ruddy River containing Two hundred and fifty seven acres, be the same more or less, bounded by Miller Sullivan and Thomas Hamilton and the widow Chandler — Together with all and Singular the right, member, Hereditaments and appurtenances to the said premises belonging or in any wise incident or appertaining To Have and To Hold all and Singular the premises before mentioned unto the said William Dunklin his heirs and assigns forever — And I do hereby bind myself my heirs Executors and Administrators to warrant and forever defend all and singular the said Premises unto the said William Dunklin his heirs, and assigns against myself & my Heirs, and against every Person whomsoever lawfully Claiming or to claim the same or any Part thereof, As Witness my hand and Seal this 17th day of March in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and eight — and in the thirty second and thirty third year of the independance of the United States of America —
