 the Beginning, Together with all and singular the rights members
 Hereditaments and appurtenances to the said premises belonging or
 in any wise incident or appertaining, To Have & To Hold all and singular
 the premises before mentioned unto the said H. S. Walker His heirs and
 assigns forever, and I do bind myself my heirs Executors & administrators
 to warrant and defend forever, all and singular the said premises unto
 the said H. S. Walker His heirs &c. against myself my heirs &c. and
 against every person whomsoever lawfully claiming or to claim
 the same or any part thereof, Witness my hand and seal this 10th
