W. 6. 75 bounding on Wm Tranum to a dogwood st thence N. 30. W. 29. 50. bounding on the said Benj. Arnold to a dogwood st thence N. 60. E. 16. 75. bounding on David Tranum to a sweet gum st on horse creek thence down the meanders of said Creek to the begining Together with all and singular the rights members hereditaments & appurtenances to the said premises belonging or in any wise incident or appertaining. To have and to hold all and singular the premises before mentioned unto the said Benj. Arnold to him his heirs & assigns forever. And I do hereby bind myself my heirs Executors and administrators to warrant and forever defend all and singular the said premises unto the said Benj. Arnold to him his heirs and assigns against me myself and my heirs and against every person whomsoever lawfully claiming or to claim the same or any part thereof.
