State South Carolina, Know all men by these presents that I John Brown of Spartanburg District, Have granted bargained & sold unto Duncan Withinson a piece of land being part of a Tract granted to Thomas Davis the fiftieth day of October one thousand seven hundred and eighty four, beginning on the bank of South Syger on the south side of said river running N. 74 W. to a post oak Corner of said Tract, thence N. 16 E. to said river from thence down the — bank of said river to the beginning, containing Fifty acres, more or less - including the whole of the land on that side of the river belonging to said Grant, which land I warrant and defend to said Withinson and his heirs for ever from all and every person laying any just right or claim to the same
