Crary all that tract or Plantation of Land supposed to contain two hundred acres be the same more or less, it being a part of a tract of four hundred and ninety one acres of Land conveyed by John Peak to the s<sup>d</sup> Lester by conveyance bearing date the 13<sup>th</sup> day of September 1803. situate in the State and District aforesaid, on some small branches of Guillemers Creek waters of Ennea River, Beginning on a red oak on the north side of the main waggon Road leading from Andersons Ford on Ennea River past James Kilgores and on to Greenville Courthouse & runs N. 43. E. 16 chains to a stake, then N. 33 E. 3.50 P. O. 34 then N. 69 E. 3.50 to a post oak 34 then N. 10 W. 20.50 to a stake corner then S. 72 E. 36 chains to a Pine corner, then S. 15. W. 20 chains to a stake corner then S. 72 E. 21.50 to a post oak corner, then S. 10 W. over said Road to a red oak corner, near the road, then up the meanders of said Road to the Beginning Red oak, which includes the full land to be conveyed be the same more or less.
