State of South Carolina Now all men by these presents that I George Gilbreath of Greenville District and State aforesaid for and in consideration of one hundred and ten Dollars paid by Jesse Gilbreath of Greenville District and State aforesaid. Have bargained granted sold and released, and by these presents do bargain grant sell and release unto the said Jesse Gilbreath all that tract plantation or parcel of land supposed to contain sixty acres be the same more or less, situate on the beaverdam Creek of South Tyger River Beginning on Sparks line at the creek thence down the Creek to Jesse Gilbreath thence on said line to the wagon Road thence up the road to Sparks line thence on said line to the Beginning, Together with all and singular the rights, members, hereditaments and appurtenances thereunto belonging or in any wise incident or appertaining therunto, to have &c to hold all and singular the premises before mentioned unto the said Jesse Gilbreath his heirs and assigns forever, And I do hereby bind myself my heirs Executors and admors to warrant and forever defend all and singular the premises unto the said Jesse Gilbreath his heirs & assigns against myself & my heirs & against every other Person whomsoever lawfully claiming or to claim the same or any part thereof, Witness my hand and seal this day of December in the year of our lord one thousand Eight hundred & Eleven Signed sealed & Delivered
