Earle a negro girl by the name of Sbt or Sby of the age of about ten years, cross eyed, which said negro girl I do warrant to be sound healthy and sensible and a slave for life, and do hereby bind myself my Executors administrators and assigns to warrant and forever defend the said negro girl and her future increase unto the said Geo. W. Earle his heirs and assigns forever against all and every person whomsoever, Witness my hand & seal this fifth day of November A.D. 1811. Sealed and acknowledged in presence of; R. H. Earle a negro boy named Bill alias Ben of the age of about fourteen or fifteen years, having a speck in his left eye, which injury the sight, which said boy I do hereby and will forever warrant unto the said George W. Earle his heirs and assigns to be sound healthy and sensible and a slave for life, free & clear of any incumbrance whatsoever, Witness my hand seal this fourth day of February A.D. 1812
