



170 State South Carolina Know all men by these Presents that I James

Fisher of Greenville District for and in consideration of the sum of one hundred dollars to me paid by Joseph King of the district aforesaid have granted bargained sold and released, and do by these presents grant bargain sell & release unto the s^r. Joseph King a tract or parcel of land in the district aforesaid on both sides of Mill Creek of S^c Paullet river beginning at a Pine running thence N. 40 W. to a red Oak thence S. 50 W. 27 ch. to a Chestnut Stake, thence S. 40 E. to a Small Pine Emory's Corner thence to the beginning containing by estimation one hundred acres, be the same more or less including the Decolling House & most of the Plantation, Together with all and singular the rights, members, hundredaments & appurtenances to the said premises, belonging or in any way appertaining To have and to hold all and singular the premises before mentioned unto the said Joseph King, And I do hereby bind myself my heirs, executor, or adm^r to warrant and save a defend "all" and singular the said premises unto the said Joseph King his heirs and assigns against me and my heirs, and against every person lawfully claiming or to claim the same or any part thereof

South Carolina Greenville District - Personally came Jacob Kytte before me John Whetten one of the Justices of the Quorum for said District and made oath as the Law directs that he saw James Fisher sign the within Deed for the within purposes and that John Pace was a Witness with himself to the same, Sworn to & subscribed before me this 8th of November 1811 - John Whetten J. Know all men by these Presents that David Garrison of the District of Greenville and State aforesaid for and in consideration of the sum of one thousand dollars to me in hand paid the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged have granted bargained sold and released and do by these presents do grant bargain sell and release unto Sylvanus Walker Junior of Greenville district & State aforesaid all that parcel or tract of land lying in Greenville district on the Golden Grove Creek containing two hundred and sixty seven acres, more or less, beginning on said Creek on land now belonging to Henry F. Walker, and running N. E. 45. 16. 50 to a Hickory Corner, thence in a direct square to a Hickory Corner on a branch of said Creek, thence up the meander of the s^d. branch to a White Oak at the head of the branch, thence to a Pine corner, thence N. E. 40. 39 to a Stake Corner thence S. E. 45. 25 to a branch which was made a Conditional between Samuel of John Ware, thence down said branch to its confluence with the little grove creek from thence down the little grove Creek to John Bowens line, land now belonging to Philip Evans thence N. W. 45. 17 to a Corner of Philip Evans land, from thence S. W. 40. 39 to the Golden Grove Creek thence up the said Creek dividing Philip Evans land and the land now to be described to the beginning corner - which above described land is a part to James Bradley & a part to Nathaniel Wood.
