 in the above Bounds together with all and singular the rights heretofore
 and appertaining thereto belonging or in anywise incident appertain-
 ing to have and to hold the premises before mentioned unto the S^r
 John Sulivant his heirs and assigns for ever. And I Richard Pope
 do hereby bind myself my heirs administrators and assigns to warrant
 to warrant and for ever defend the premises before mentioned unto the
 said John Sulivant his heirs administrators and assigns against
 myself and my heirs and against every other person lawfully claim-
 ing or to claim the same or any part thereof, Witness my hand
 and this Ninth day of June Eighteen hundred and Eleven and
 in the 36th Year of the American Independence
