Together with all and singular the rights, members, hereditaments, and appurtenances to said premises, belonging or in any wise incident or appertaining, To have and To hold all and singular the premises before mentioned unto the said Street Thruson his heirs and assigns, forever, And I do hereby bind myself my heirs executors and administrators to warrant and forever defend all and singular the said Premises unto the said Street Thruson his heirs and assigns, against myself my heirs and against every other person or persons whomsoever lawfully claiming the same or any part thereof, Witness my hand and seal this Eleventh day of May Eighteen hundred and Thirteen, signed sealed and delivered in presence of B. The State of South Carolina, Know all men by these presents that James Blair of Franklin county State of Georgia for and in consideration of the sum of Eighty two dollars to me in hand paid by David Morrow of Greenville District State of South Carolina have granted bargained sold and released and by these presents do grant bargain sell and release unto the said David Morrow all that tract or plantation of land containing one hundred and four acres, be the same more or less, Beginning on a stake running N. 65 W. 28 C. 50 lk. to a stake thence S. 25 W. 36 Ch. to a stake thence S. 65 E. 28 C. 50 lk. to a black oak, thence N. 25 E. 36 Ch. to the beginning. It being part of a tract of land originally granted to Peter Swainy containing six hundred and forty acres granted by his excellency William Moultrie the 6th day of March 1785. it being on a branch of Cripples Creek water of Reedy River Greenville District. Together with all and singular the right, members, hereditaments, and appurtenances, to the said Premises belonging or in any wise incident or appertaining, To have & To hold all and singular the premises before mentioned unto the said David Morrow his heirs and assigns, forever, And I do hereby bind myself my heirs executors and administrators,
