Granted, bargained, sold and released, and by these presents do Grant
bargain, sell, and release, unto the said Alexander Sloan six half acre
lots in the village of Greenville, known in the plan of the said village
as of record in the Clerks office, by the following numbers, to wit No 1 being
a corner lot, on which the said Sloan now keeps his store, No 2 & 3
back of said last mentioned lot, and No 16 a front lot adjoining N. 1
and fronting on the large street leading through the village to the
River and Nos 17 and 18 immediately back of lot No 16, the said
six lots being bounded on all sides by streets, together with all and singular
the rights, members, hereditaments, and appurtenances, to the aforesaid
six lots of land belonging or in any wise incident or appertaining; to have
and to hold all and singular the premises before mentioned unto the
said Alexander Sloan his heirs and assigns forever. And I do hereby
bind myself, my heirs, Executors, and administrators, to warrant and
forever defend all and singular the said six lots above described
unto the said Alexander Sloan his heirs and assigns against
