 from low water mark to a Swamp P. oak 3<sup>rd</sup> the distance being about 50 chains  
 thence North 76° E<sup>t</sup> 46 chains on Richard Manning and Charles Easter's lines  
 to a maple 3<sup>rd</sup> on the Beaverdam Creek, thence down the meanders of said Creek to the  
 beginning. Together with all and singular the rights, members hereditaments & appurtenan-  
 ces to the said premises belonging or in any wise incident or appertaining. To have & to hold  
 all and singular the premises before mentioned unto the said Catharine Matlock her  
 heirs and assigns forever; and I do hereby bind myself my heirs executors & administrators  
 to warrant and forever defend all and singular the said premises unto the said  
 Catharine Matlock her heirs and assigns against myself and my heirs & against  
 every other person whomsoever lawfully claiming or to claim the said or any

 sell and release unto the said Benjamin Brister all that Plantation or tract  
 of land containing Sixteen acres (or the same more or less) Situate in the  
 district aforesaid lying on the South Fork of Horse Creek waters of Reedy  
 river, beginning on a red Oak 3<sup>rd</sup> on said Creek, running thence N 48° W 11  
 chains to a small hickory 3<sup>rd</sup> bounding on James Lovell's land thence N 80  
 W 33 chain, to a Stake 3<sup>rd</sup> bounding on Clifton Easter's land thence North 1.20  
 to a red Oak 3<sup>rd</sup>, thence East 111 chain, bounding on the said Benjamin  
 Brister to the Beginning. Together with all and singular the rights, members  
 hereditaments and appurtenances to the said premises belonging or in any wise  
 incident or appertaining. To have & to hold all & singular the premises  
 before mentioned unto the said Benjamin Brister his heirs and assigns  
 forever. And I do hereby bind myself my heirs executors & administrators  
 to warrant and forever defend all and singular the said premises
