 Waters of the middle fork of Saluda, being a part of two Surveys, beginning at a Lightwood N. 34.  
 G. Pottles 34. thence S. 32 W 60 ch. to a Stake 34, thence S. 58 E 17.50 to a Stake 34, thence on to a  
 W. O. 34 W. H. Cooke, 34, thence N. 55 E. to a Stake on a conditional line which separates the land  
 from John Looch, thence along the said line to the beginning. Together with all and singular the  
 premises before mentioned unto the said Cooke and his heirs forever. And I do hereby bind my  
 self my heirs & each and every of my executors and administrators to warrant and forever defend  
 all & singular the said premises unto the said Cooke & his heirs or assigns from myself  
 & my heirs & from every other person or persons whomsoever lawfully claiming or to claim the same
