of the district of Greenville and State aforesaid for and in consideration of the sum of five  
hundred dollars to us paid by James Tarrant Sen<sup>r</sup> of Greenville district & State aforesaid  
Have granted bargained sold and released, and by these presents do grant bargain  
sell and release unto the said James Tarrant All that Plantation or tract of land  
containing one hundred acre, more or less, wherein the s<sup>r</sup>d James Tarrant now lives  
being part of six hundred and forty acre, originally granted to Joseph Reed on the <sup>sixteenth</sup> tenth  
day of July 1784, and deeded to John Tarrant by Joseph Reed on the tenth day of  
May 1793, Bounded by John Bowes original line on the West & West, by the Golden  
Grove on the East & East, and on Benjamin Tarrant's line on the S. S. West —  
Together with all and singular the rights numbers headaments and appertinances to the  
said premises belonging or in any wise incident or appertaining thereto, to have & to hold  
all and singular the premises before mentioned, unto the said James Tarrant his heirs & assigns  
forever, against myself my heirs, & assigns & against all other persons whomsoever  
lawfully claiming or to claim the same or any part thereof. Witness our hands  
and seals this seventh day of January, one thousand eight hundred & fifteen  
& in the thirty ninth year of the sovereignty & independence of the United States of America.
