aforesaid have granted bargained sold and released, and by these presents do
grant bargain sell and release unto the said Samuel Williams a plantation &
tract of land whereon James Dickerson now lives, containing five hundred acres, to the same
more or less, lying on the North east side of the Golden grove Creek, on the booring mill
branch, beginning on a Poplar Corner 13 from thence down the main Grove Creek to a
Chinquipin Corner 34 at Ambrose Blackburns old bridge, from thence along the line South
