

530. Summy one certain lot piece or parcel of land containing one  
 acre be the same more or less within the bound, herein after mention  
 site ab lying and being in the Village at Greenville Courthouse in the  
 State of South Carolina being the same lot whereon the said Jacob  
 Summy is now building a framed House lying without the limits  
 of the plan a chart of the said Village as heretofore laid off by Colonel  
 Alston and Recorded in the Clerk's office at Greenville Courthouse but is a  
 corner lot fronting two hundred and thirty five feet on the north boundary  
 street and one hundred and forty feet on main street, Beginning at a  
 stake on the west side of main street ninety feet above the N.E. corner  
 of lot numbered in the plan of said Village fifty one. So as to leave  
 north boundary street between them running thence N.  $1\frac{1}{2}$  degrees E. one hundred  
 and forty feet to a stake thence N.  $72\frac{1}{2}$  degrees West two hundred and  
 thirty five feet to a stake thence S.  $1\frac{1}{2}$  degrees West 140 feet to a  
 stake thence S.  $72\frac{1}{2}$  degrees East two hundred and thirty five feet  
 to the Beginning, intending to range in Correspondence with streets and  
 buildings of the original plan of said Village; Together with all and  
 singular the rights, members, hereditaments, and appurtenances to the  
 said premises belonging or in any wise incident or appertaining.  
 To have and To hold all and singular the premises before mentioned  
 unto the said Jacob Summy his heirs and assigns forever and I do  
 hereby bind myself my heirs, Executors & administrators to warrant and  
 forever defend all and singular the said premises unto the said Jacob  
 Summy his heirs and assigns against myself and my heirs and against  
 all other person or persons whatsoever lawfully claiming or to claim the  
 same or any part thereof - Witness my hand and seal this 30<sup>th</sup> day of  
 July in the 41<sup>st</sup> year of the Independence of the United States, A.D. 1816.

 South Carolina Greenville district, Personally came Hardy J. Gilreath  
 before me the subscribing Justice and being duly sworn on his solemn  
 affirmation maketh oath that he saw Vardry M. Bee acknowledge the  
 foregoing deed of conveyance to Jacob Summy for the uses and  
 purposes therein mentioned and that he signed his name as a  
 witness to the said Acknowledgment. Sworn & subscribed to this 18<sup>th</sup>

 Recorded the 15<sup>th</sup> day of September 1816.

530. Know all men by these Presents that I Captain John  
 M. Clendenen of the district and State of South Carolina in consideration of one hundred  
 dollars to me paid by John Archer of Pendleton district and State aforesaid  
 have granted bargained sold and released and by these presents do gra  
 nt bargain sell and release unto the said John Archer all that piece pa  
 cel or tract of land supposed to contain one hundred acres be the same more  
 or less being part of a tract of land originally granted to Joseph Langston situate  
 in Greenville district at the foot of Parry's mountain on the waters of reed  
 y. River Beginning at a Stake corner on the original line of said Joseph  
 Langston's old Survey (next to the mountain) thence South <sup>running</sup> eighty degrees  
 west to a Pine corner near to & below the ore bank on the side of a path  
 thence South Eighty two degrees west down a hollow and branch to the line
