my heirs, executors and administrators, to warrant and forever
defend all and singular the said premises unto the said Joseph
Rutledge just his heirs and assigns against myself and my heirs
and against every person whomsoever lawfully claiming or to
claim the same or any part thereof. Witness my hand and seal
this the thirty first of October 1813 in the year of our Lord and
in the thirty eighth year of American Independence —

State aforesaid for and in consideration of the sum of two hundred
and twenty ^{four} dollars to me in hand paid by John N. Clinton
of said District & State have granted bargain and sold
and by these presents do grant bargain sell and release a
certain tract or parcel of Land lying in said district on the
waters of Reedy River bounded as follows by Joseph Rut-
leage just Alexander, on the South, and John Ashmores
Land on the west and William B. Ray on the North & John
Sandford on the East begining on a Stake corner and running
due E. 73° to a Red Oak corner thence S 20 W. 42.50 to a post oak
Constitutional corner made by said Joseph Rutledge & John Sam
