39 The following "Office Copy" of the Last Will and Testament of Daniel
Brown dec^d was presented and recorded this 26th of April 1817. viz.

I Daniel Brown of Camden attorney at Law, declare
this to be my last will and Testament. Imprimis. I give
the tract of five thousand acres of Land lying in the State of
Tennessee which I purchased of Charles Polk (for which I
have his obligation to make titles) to Samuel Lee of
Salisbury in Connecticut for the use of his Children by
my sister Elizabeth. I order my Executors herein after men-
tioned not to accept of any composition in money, but to
pursue the Legal methods to obtain titles, and to convey the
same to Samuel Lee with full powers to him to sell again.

Item, I give all the rest of my estate both real & personal
to my beloved wife Mary Brown, late Mary Polk to her, her
heirs and assigns forever.

Item I give to my nephew Daniel Bush of Pittsfield
in Massachusetts, twenty guineas, with Interest of Seven
per Cent from the twentieth of December, one thousand
seven hundred and ninety one, to be paid in one and two
Years after my decease to his mother for the use of the
said Daniel Bush —

Item. In case my present illness proves fatal, I desire
my wife to furnish my Cousin, Alfred Henry Brown with
fifty hundred dollars in cash or good credit, taking
