This Indenture made this 6<sup>th</sup> day of December in the year of our  
Lord one thousand eight hundred and sixteen, between John  
Steed of Greenville district and State of S. Carolina of  
the one part, and David L. M. Daniel of the same district  
and State aforesaid of the other part, Witnesseth, that the  
said John Steed for and in consideration of the just sum of  
four hundred dollars to him paid by the said David L. M.  
Daniel the receipt whereof the said John Steed doth hereby  
acknowledge, and hath granted bargained and sold, and  
by these presents doth bargain and sell unto the s<sup>d</sup>. David  
L. M. Daniel his heirs and assigns forever, one certain  
tract of Land situate lying and being in the district aforesaid,  
on the parting ridge between the waters of Enoree &  
Kedy rivers, containing one hundred acres of Land  
more or less and bounded as follows, *Viz*, Beginning  
on a red Oak corner, bounded on Moses Bates' Land thence  
along the original line an East course to a Conditional  
Corner, made on a Gum between Moses Bates & Martin  
Conner, thence along the said line to Moses Bates' old  
line, thence along said line a South course to a red Oak Cor-  
ner, thence a West course to a fork of a branch, thence along  
the said branch to a Persimmon Corner, thence a West course  
& Conditional line made between Andrew Cooksey and Ervick  
Cooksey to a Black Jack Corner thence a straight line a  
North course to a Cherrnut Corner, then down a branch  
to a fork, thence up the fork to the head of the branch on  
a Pine Corner made between Martin Conner & John  
Bates, then North to a Lightwood Corner at the Edge of the  
old field then the Conditional line to Lightwood Corner  
of John Bates' Corner, thence North to a red Oak corner
