E. 20 a cross the S. Rocky fork to a post Oak thence N. 20 E. a bout 33 to a Red Oak thence S. 16 W. 15 to a poplar thence S. 77. W 13 to the Beginning including the Plantation whereof William Halliday now lives with fifty acres of land be the same more or less together with all and singular the rights members hereditaments & appurtenances to the S^d premises belonging or in any wise incident or appertaining to have & to hold all & singular the premises before mentioned unto the S^d William Halliday his heirs & assigns forever & we do hereby bind ourselves our heirs Executors & Administrators to warrant & forever defend all & singular the said premises unto the S^d William Halliday his heirs & assigns against ourselves & each of our heirs & against every person whomsoever lawfully claiming or to claim the same or any part thereof Witness our hands & seals this Twenty sixth day of December one Thousand Eight Hundred & eleven & in the forty first year of the American Independence signed & Delivered in presence of us
