 his heirs &c. for ever Provided always & notwithstanding that the S<sup>r</sup>. Moses  
 Butler his heirs &c. shall & do well & truly pay or cause to be paid the S<sup>r</sup>.  
 B. Wilgore his certain Attorney, his heirs &c. the full & just sum of Eighty six  
 Dollars thirty five cents according to the true intent & meaning of the note or  
 obligation aforesd. & of these presents then the Deed of bargain & Sale & all & every  
 claim Article or thing therein contained shall determine, be utterly Void & of  
 none effect, any thing herein contained to the contrary thereof in any wise  
 notwithstanding: and it is hereby declared by & between these parties that the  
 S<sup>r</sup>. Moses Butler for himself his heirs &c. doth Covenant promise & agree  
 to & with the S<sup>r</sup>. B. Wilgore his heirs &c. by these presents that if default  
 should happen to be made of or in any payment of the S<sup>r</sup>. Eighty six Dollars  
 thirty five cents according to the true intent & meaning of the S<sup>r</sup>. note or  
 obligation & these presents, that then & in such case it shall & may be lawful to  
 & for the S<sup>r</sup>. B. Wilgore his certain Attorney &c. from time to time & all times  
 hereafter Peaceably & quietly to take the S<sup>r</sup>. property into his or their poss-  
 -ession, & the same to hold & retain to his own proper use & behoof as his  
 own property from henceforth & forever or the same to sell & dispose of  
 at his pleasure returning the overplus (if any should happen to remain  
 after paying the S<sup>r</sup>. sum of Eighty six Dollars thirty five cents together
