William Cunningham, his heirs and assigns against myself my heirs, and against every other person or persons whomsoever lawfully claiming or to claim the same or any part thereof. And as witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal this Sixth day of January in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and nineteen, and in the forty second year of the American Independence. Creek thence up s^d. Creek following the meanders of s^d. Creek to a sweet gum corner, thence S. 7 E. 1. 75 links to a hickory corner in a rocky place, thence N. 35 W. 1 ch. 75 to a sourwood corner on the bank of said creek, thence up s^d. Creek following
