thence on a line of marked trees till it strikes the upper end of said land, joining lands of Thomas Howard, coming upon a rock; beginning on the lower end of said land by the road, so as to make it the line between us, up to the shoal path, then the path and marked trees as before mentioned to be the line between us from the road; supposed to contain one hundred and fifteen acres, more or less. Together with all singular the rights members hereditaments and appurtenances to the said premises belonging, or in any wise incident or appertaining. To have and to hold all and singular the said part of the tracts above mentioned, unto the said William Barton, his heirs and assigns forever. And I do hereby bind myself my heirs Executors and Administrators to warrant and for ever defend the said premises unto the said William Barton his heirs and assigns against myself and my heirs claiming or to claim the same or any part thereof. Witness my hand and seal this twenty sixth day of November in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and eighteen - Signed Sealed & delivered in presence of us Geo. W. Holcombe - Anaisa Underwood David Barton Joseph Barton
