thence S 52. W. 4 Chains to a post oak, thence S 40. W. 38. 50. Crossing said  
Creek to a red oak on William Calloways line, thence with said  
line 8 chain to a poplar on a branch thence up said branch with  
with its meanders 15 Chain to a maple, thence to a chestnut  
oak on the ridge between Grim's Halcomb & John Forest thence  
N. 11. E. 15. to a black gum on said creek Crossing the same  
N. 5. W. 4. 50. to a white oak on a rock in a shoof  
a Branch, thence S. 48. E. 30. 50 to a Spanish oak on said  
Creek crossing the same N. 15. E. 37. 50.
