


56 Know all men by these presents that Samuel Bell of Simpson County and State of Kentucky do hereby constitute and appoint my trusty friend James Bell of the same county and State my lawful attorney in fact for the express purpose of selling and making legal titles & conveyances to all the land that I may be entitled to from James Tull by deed recorded in the clerks office of Quinville County South Carolina lying on the waters of Sabama and head branch of Tedy River in said County and to collect and receive all money that may be collected from the sale of said land and receipt for the same hereby ratifying and confirming all the transactions that said attorney may perform either by using my name or otherwise as if done in my own proper person. In testimony whereof I have hereunto subscribed my name & affixed my seal this 1st day of October 1819 -
