Together with all & singular the rights, members hereditaments, and appurtenances to the said premises, belonging or in any wise <sup>incident or</sup> appertaining. To have & to hold all and singular the premises before mentioned unto the said Jeremiah Cleveland his heirs and assigns forever. And I do hereby bind myself my heirs executors and administrators, to warrant and forever defend all & singular the said premises unto the said Jeremiah Cleveland his heirs & assigns, against myself & my heirs & against every other person or persons whomsoever claiming or to claim the same or any part thereof. Witness my hand & seal this 22<sup>nd</sup> of December in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and nineteen, and in the 44<sup>th</sup> year of the American Independence.

Daniel of the district of Greenville and State aforesaid, for and in consideration of the sum of fifty dollars to me in hand paid by Jeremiah Cleveland of the district and State aforesaid have granted bargained and sold unto the said Jeremiah Cleveland, all that parcel of land situate lying and being in district and State aforesaid & on the Water of the golden Grove Creek, bounded as follows, begining at a Stone on Jeremiah Cleveland's line, thence N. 60 E. 11 chains 75 links on Carter Tarrants line to a Post Oak on Aaron Paynes line thence S. 70 to the E to a branch, thence down the meanders of the branch to Jeremiah Cleveland's line thence S. 45 E. to the beginning containing eight acres more or less, together with all and singular the other members hereditaments and appurtenances to the said land belonging or in any wise incident or appertaining, to have and to hold, all and singular the same
