for and in consideration of the sum of twenty dollars to me in
hand paid by Nancy Barbary of the same place have bargained
sold and delivered, and by these presents do bargain sell & in
plain and open market deliver unto Nancy Barbary, Two feather
beds, bedsteads, & furniture, half a dozen sitting chairs three cotton
wheels, one flax wheel & one reel - one loom, a pine cupboard, and
half a dozen putter plates, two iron pots one oven, one pine table
one chest, one box, and 2 pair cotton cards - six or seven barrels of
corn in the crib. To have and to hold the said bargained
property unto the said Nancy Barbary her heirs and assigns
forever. And I do warrant and defend the said bargained
property unto the said Nancy Barbary against myself and
every other person claiming the same.
