Know all men by these presents that I Joseph Ayres of the district aforesaid for the sum of three thousand three hundred & forty six dollars paid to me by Hughes Stokes of the same state and district have granted bargained, sold, released and by these presents do grant bargain sell and release unto to the said Hughes Stokes his heirs and assigns forever: all that part of a certain tract of land lying and being in the state and district aforesaid, on the waters of needy river, originally granted to Henry Tompkins alias Tompkins for six hundred and forty acres, the part intended to be conveyed beginning on a stake on the original line, thence N 66 W 40 to a dogwood, the original corner; thence N 24 E 80 to a red oak 3x thence S 66 E 40 to a stake on the original line, thence S 24 W 80 to the beginning; containing 320 acres more or less, being one half of the original tract, and also part of one other tract adjoining the above granted to Thomas Jenkins beginning on a red oak 3x near the road called Kellits thence along the said Road to the Flat Rock branch thence down the same with the Meanders to Reedy River; thence down the river to an Iron wood 3x thence S 66 E 39 to a dogwood 3x thence to the beginning, containing two hundred and twelve acres more or less. (in the whole 532 acres more or less) Together with all and singular the rights, members, incidents and appurtenances to the same belonging, or in any wise incident or appertaining; To have and to hold all and singular the said premises unto the said Hughes Stokes his heirs and assigns forever. And I do hereby bind myself my heirs, executors & administrators to warrant and for ever defend the premises as described unto the said
