to a white oak on the Eth bank of the river running thence up the Eth
to a stone corner on the Wth bank of the river thence up the river
to another stone corner a conditional corner made between said
Langford & others Swafford thence along a conditional line to a
hickory corner thence N to a hickory corner thence S to a post oak
corner thence to the Beginning corner containing by estimation
One hundred acres to the same more or less. Together with all and
singular the rights, members, hereditaments, & appurtenances to the said
premises belonging or in any wise incident or appertaining. To have
and to hold all and singular the premises before mentioned unto the said
John Cottenham his heirs & assigns, forever. And I do bind myself my
heirs &c^r & adm^r to warrant & forever defend all & singular
the said premises unto the said John Cottenham his heirs & assigns
against myself & my heirs & against every other person whomsoever
lawfully claiming or to claim the same or any part thereof

desire or fear of any person or persons whosoever to convey & release
unto the within named John W^m Cottenham his heirs & assigns all her interest
& estate & also all her right and claim of dower of in or to all & singular
the premises within mentioned & released. Given under my hand
