

The act is hereby acknowledge have granted bargain sold and released and by these presents do grant bargain sell and release unto the said W. Brock one certain Lot of land situated lying and being in the Village of Pleasantburg at Greenville Court House in the state of S<sup>c</sup> Carolina known & distinguished in the plan or chart of said village by the number twenty two (22) containing one hundred & forty feet front on main street and one hundred and seventeen and a half feet on the cross street below Mr. Wickliff's. beginning at a stake corner on the west side of main street running thence North 74 $\frac{1}{2}$  degrees west 117 $\frac{1}{2}$  feet to a stake thence S<sup>o</sup> 15 $\frac{1}{2}$  degrees west 140 feet to a stake thence S<sup>o</sup> 74 $\frac{1}{2}$  degrees east one hundred and seventeen & a half feet to a stake on the side of main street thence North 15 $\frac{1}{2}$  degrees E<sup>o</sup> one hundred and forty feet along main street to the beginning containing half acre be<sup>th</sup> same more or less. Together with all singular the premises before mentioned the hereditaments appertaining to the land premises belonging or in any wise incident or appertaining to have and to hold all and singular the Premises before mention unto the said Walker Brock his heirs & assigns for ever, & I do hereby bind myself my heirs Executors & administrators to warrant & forever defend all & singular the said premises unto the said Walker Brock his heirs & assigns any persons or persons claiming by or through or under me this said Lot.
