land against myself, my heir, exor. &c. or any claim of any
person or persons whatsoever. In witness whereof I have hereunto
set my hand & affixed my seal, this 19th day of August 1820.

State of South Carolina. Know all men by these presents that I Matthew 249
Cockrum of Greenville district in consideration of the sum of three
hundred & seventy five dollars to me paid by Elias R. Whitten of Greenville
district and state aforesaid have granted, bargained, sold & released
and by these presents do grant, bargain, sell and release unto the
said Elias R. Whitten a plantation, or tract of land, lying & being
in the district of Greenville & state aforesaid, on both sides of Greens
creek of S^o parolote river. Beginning at a history of Campbells
Survey on the W. side of the creek and running thence S 30 E ch^s
20 links to a chestnut thence S 28 E 10 ch. 25 ch. to a stake thence
N 60 E (crossing the creek) 25 ch to a chestnut thence N 30 W 10 ch 25 ch
to a chestnut thence N 70 W 12¹/₂ ch 75 ch. to a black oak thence
N 35 W 50 ch to a chestnut, thence S 55 W 13 ch to a chestnut Oak
thence N 50 W 22 ch to a chestnut, thence S 30 W 20 ch to a stake
(crossing the creek) thence to the beginning, containing by estimation
one hundred and ninety eight acres, be the same more or less, including
the dwelling house, plantation &c. whereon I now live being a part
of the tract of land two of them surveyed for Duncan Campbell
