 Testament of William Blasingame deceased of Carraw district
 and State aforesaid he left a certain negro woman named Dill to
 his Son William Blasingame & in case of his death before he
 become of age the value of Said negro woman was to be equally
 divided between the Surviving legates viz. John Blasingame
 Thomas Blasingame James Blasingame & Mary Blasingame
 now the wife of P. Benson & as the Said Wm. Blasingame
 did die before he became of age we the legates agreeable to
 our names subscribed do acknowledge to have received fifty
 dollars each from James Blasingame in full for our
 parts of Said negro woman & her increase we warrant
 and defend Said negro from ourselves our heirs & assigns
 unto the Said James Blasingame his heirs & assigns -
 Witness our hands and Seals this 24th of June 1810 -

 paid by Littleberry Holcombe, of the State & district aforesaid have
 granted bargain'd sold & released & by these presents do grant
 bargain sell release confirm & convey unto the said Littleberry
 Holcombe all that plantation, tract or parcel of land contain-
 -ing twelve acres more or less Situate Lying & being in the State
 & district aforesaid on waters of Packs Creek beginning on a white
 oak the Second corner to the tract of land whereon the said
 Littleberry Holcombe now lives and running East with his
 line till it strikes the Gap Creek road, thence up the said
 road till it intersects with Jonathan Stokes' line, thence a
 west course on said line to a red oak Stokes' S.W. corner
