 To be the same more or less for and in consideration of
 the sum of four hundred dollars to me to Be paid
 By the sd B. Jones of state and District of our said begin
 gion both sides of little Durban Creek Beginning on a black
 Oak Dead near George Lyons fence running thence S. 80
 E. 66.50. to post oak thence N. 13. E. 18. to a stake 37. thence N. 70.
 W. 63. to stake on Abner Jones line thence S. 20. W. 30.
 Chains to the Beginning which include the land sold and
 conveyed to be the same more or less the land conveyed
 Was originally granted to William Stul Binding on
 John Cannaday, Edward Howard, George Lyons, and
 Abner Jones, Together with all and singular the rights
 members and incidents, appurtenances to the sd pre
 mises belonging or in any wise incident or appertain
 ing to have and to hold all singular the premises before
 mentioned unto the sd Benjamin Jones his heirs assigns
 And administrators I do here by Bind my self my
 Heirs my Executors and administrators to warrant and
 forever defend all and singular the premises to the
 sd Benjamin Jones his heirs assigns and administrators

And also against every other person or persons who what
 sever claiming, or to claim any part there of as wit
 ness whereof I have here unto set my hand and seal
