my sons William E. Blasingame, and John Will. Blasingame and
for and toward the better support and maintenance of them
After my decease, as the sum of two dollars to me in hand paid
by the said William E. and John Will. Blasingame, the receipt
whereof is hereby acknowledged have given granted
bargained, sold released and conveyed and by these
presents do give, grant, bargain, sell, and release and con-
vey unto the said William E. Blasingame and John Will. Blasingame
all that plantation, tract or parcel of land situate lying and
being in the district of Grunville in the state aforesaid on the waters of
Saluda and Reedy Rivers containing by estimation eight hundred
and sixty four ^{and a half} acres the same more or less being that part of
my late husband John Blasingame deceased estate, which was
sold by an order from the Court of Common Pleas of Grunville
District that I purchased at said sale and conveyed to one
by name of Underwood Esquire Sheriff of Grunville District
