 State aforesaid for and in consideration of the sum of Eighty dollars to me paid and paid by Jeremiah Cleveland of the District and State aforesaid the Receipt and payment I do hereby acknowledge have granted, bargained, sold and released all that piece parcel or tract of land originally granted to Michael Dickson lying in the district and State aforesaid on the waters of Saluda River Beginning on a red oak oak 37 thence N. 15 E. 60 40. Thomas Hooper 37 thence the said Cleveland's land thence S. 65 E. 28. to Hooper 37 thence S 30. W 91. to the beginning Red oak 37 East Hunt's corner N. containing Sixty six acres more or less which land was granted to the said Michael Dickson on the 3<sup>d</sup> day of February 1823 by His Excellency John L. Wilson and recorded in Volume 77. Second Chap. page 285 a reference being had to the plat annexed to the original grant will more fully show which land was sold by the Sheriff of Greenville District by virtue of a fieri facias for costs and purchased by the said J. H. Goodlett and now conveyed from the said Goodlett to the said Cleveland together with all and singular the Rights, liberties, tenements and appurtenances thereunto belonging or in any wise incident or appertaining To Have and to Hold all and singular the said premises unto the said Jeremiah Cleveland him and his heirs or assigns forever and I do hereby warrant and defend the said premises to the said Jeremiah Cleveland him and his heirs or assigns from me and my heirs or assigns or any other person or persons lawfully claiming,
