Together with all and singular the rights members hereditaments and appurtenances to the said premises to Have and To Hold all and singular the premises before mentioned unto the Said Hudson Bury, his heirs and assigns for ever and I do hereby bind myself my heirs Executors and administrators to warrant and for ever defend all and singular the said premises unto the said Hudson Bury his heirs and assigns against myself and my heirs and against every other person whomsoever lawfully claiming or to claim the same or any part thereof Witness my hand and seal this Eleventh day of February in the year of our Lord One thousand Eight hundred and twenty and in the forty fourth year of the American Independence Signed sealed and delivered in presence of us

South Carolina To all to whom these presents shall come I, James McDaniel Sheriff of Greenville district, and State aforesaid Send greeting; where as, by virtue of a writ of Fieri Facias issued out of the Court of Common pleas held for the district of Greenville tested the thirtieth day of January in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and Twenty three at the Suit of Paschal Rutledge and assigned over to Amariah Cleveland to mediate directed Commanding me that of the goods and Chattels lands and tenements of Rich and Sister to levy the the sum of four hundred and forty dollars damages and Costs, I have seized and taken of the lands and tenements of the said Rich and Sister, all that certain piece, parcel and tract of land, containing two hundred acres more or less situate and being in the district of Greenville and State aforesaid on the banks Creek waters of Ruddy River and bounded as follows Beginning at a Spanish oak corner
